Forged in the Burgundy region of France and rectangular in shape, the open cage built with iron strap construction, features a large hinged door with working padlock. When opened, the cabinet reveals 9 rows, each row accommodating up to 8 bottles, for a total of 72 bottles! The wine rack is in excellent condition commensurate with age and use, and adorns the original patinated rust painted finish. Key and lock included; a great way to keep your expensive bottles safe and secure! The French wine region of Burgundy (aka "Bourgogne") may be small in size, but its influence is huge in the world of vino. The complexity of Burgundy can cast fear into the heart of even a seasoned wine pro, but fear not - the region need only be as complicated as you want it to be. Yes, it is home to some of the most expensive wines in the known universe, but there are also tasty and affordable wines. Located in the east-central part of France, Burgundy has 5 primary wine growing areas (not including Beaujolais and Châtillonnais): Chablis, Côte de Nuits, Côte de Beaune, Côte Chalonnaise, and Mâconnais.
