



## 19TH CENTURY FRENCH LOUIS XVI SILVERED BRONZE SURTOUT DE TABLE STAMPED BACCARAT

This refined antique French surtout de table, stamped Baccarat on the underside of the mirrored plateau, was crafted circa 1880 and reflects the elegant symmetry and neoclassical restraint associated with the Louis XVI aesthetic. The Baccarat mark refers to the prestigious French crystal manufactory founded in 1764 in Lorraine, which rose to international prominence during the 19th century under royal and imperial patronage. By the time of Napoleon III, Baccarat had become synonymous with luxury crystal, fine tableware, and exceptional mirrored glass used in palatial interiors and formal dining settings. The presence of this stamp significantly enhances the desirability of the piece, linking it to one of France's most celebrated decorative arts houses. The generous oval form is executed in silvered bronze with a finely stepped and reeded border, creating a crisp architectural frame around the luminous mirrored surface. Raised on four sculptural acanthus-scroll feet, the tray has both elevation and sculptural balance, lending it true presence on a dining table or buffet. The silvered bronze retains a soft, timeworn patina that highlights the precision of the casting and the graceful curvature of the mounts. Designed to amplify candlelight and crystal during formal dining service, the mirrored plateau reflects porcelain, stemware, and floral arrangements, adding depth and brilliance to the overall presentation. The mirror shows light age spotting consistent with its late 19th century origin, enhancing its authentic antique character without detracting from its beauty. Traditionally serving as the foundation for elaborate centerpieces, this antique Louis XVI style surtout de table now works beautifully as a bar presentation tray, a base for candelabra, or as a striking focal point atop a dining table, console, or sideboard.
