Camille Fauré (1874-1956) was a prominent French enamel artist, renowned for his contributions to the decorative arts, particularly through his collaborations with the Limoges pottery company. He gained recognition for his mastery of enamelwork, characterized by vibrant colors, intricate patterns, and innovative techniques. His designs often featured large floral motifs and figurative patterns, blending the organic elegance of the Art Nouveau movement with the boldness of Art Deco influences. Fauré's signature style included raised, textured enamelwork, which gave his creations a striking three-dimensional quality.
