Keep newspapers, magazines, and books neatly organized with this elegant antique Canterbury magazine rack. Crafted in Provence, France circa 1920, the decorative stand is designed in the Louis XV taste and features finely carved giltwood framing with graceful rocaille scrolls, floral accents, and curved legs ending in scrolled feet.

The rack is fitted with double caned panels that open outward and are held in place by small metal chains, creating a practical divided interior for storing reading material. A carved upper handle allows the piece to be moved easily from room to room, while the folding construction adds both function and visual interest. When closed, the Canterbury becomes notably compact, making it easy to place beside a sofa, armchair, desk, or library table.

The warm gilt finish has developed an attractive aged patina that highlights the carved details and gives the piece the character expected of an antique French furnishing. Both decorative and useful, this Louis XV Provincial magazine rack would make a refined addition to a living room, library, office, or bedroom.

The antique Canterbury is in excellent condition commensurate with age and use, with age-appropriate wear to the gilt finish and cane.
