The petite rocker features the iconic steam-bent beechwood frame, showcasing graceful, continuous curves that form the arms, legs, and rockers with elegant fluidity.

The seat and back are fitted with hand-woven cane panels, offering both comfort and visual lightness while highlighting the craftsmanship associated with classic Thonet-style furniture. The open armrests and gently reclined back create a relaxed, inviting silhouette perfectly scaled for a child.

The piece is in excellent condition commensurate with age and use, with a warm and rich walnut patina and minor wear to the cane consistent with its age, adding to its authentic character. Both decorative and functional, this antique rocker would be ideal in a nursery, bedroom, or as a whimsical accent in a living space.

Michael Thonet (1796–1871) was a pioneering German-Austrian cabinetmaker credited with developing the bentwood technique, revolutionizing furniture design with his innovative use of steam-shaped wood.
