The design reflects Thonet's mastery of steam-bent wood techniques. Its versatile form allows for a variety of uses: it may serve as extra seating in a den, study, or game room, as a charming side table beside a chair or sofa, as a low footstool, or even as a decorative plant stand. Both functional and stylish, this piece embodies the enduring elegance of classic European design.
