Charming and atmospheric, this pair of antique winter landscapes was painted circa 1880 and captures the quiet poetry of rural life. Signed "Carlier" in the lower corners, each oil on panel composition features a solitary female figure making her way through a serene snow-covered setting—one walking past a rustic stone cottage under bare-limbed trees, the other traversing a quiet woodland path beneath a pale winter sky. The artist's restrained palette of greys, whites, and ochres enhances the tranquil, nostalgic mood of both scenes. The paintings are attributed to Jules Carlier, a 19th-century artist active in France whose works, though not widely documented, have appeared in European auctions. Known for his intimate landscapes and rustic village views, Carlier's style is marked by soft brushwork and a sensitive treatment of light and atmosphere, as seen in this elegant pair. Each work is housed in its original carved and giltwood frame, adorned with foliate and beaded moldings. Measuring 14.5 inches wide by 10 inches high overall, the antique paintings are in excellent condition with minor craquelure and a warm patina consistent with age. A refined and lyrical duo, perfect for adding historical charm and subtle beauty to a study, library, or traditional interior.
