The ceramic vases are both hand painted with floral, leaf, and bird motifs in the traditional rust, white and blue Imari palette. The colorful table lamps are in excellent condition with new wiring. Shades not included. Marking: Marbro manufacture for further authentication. Imari ware is a Western term for a brightly-colored style of Arita ware Japanese export porcelain made in the area of Arita, in the former Hizen Province, northwestern Kyushu. They were exported to Europe in large quantities, especially between the second half of the 17th century and the first half of the 18th century. Measures: 9.5" diameter x 38.75" height.
